Public Issues—MCNZ

The church is preparing our response to climate change by bringing a policy for climate justice to Conference 2018.

Climate justice requires us to reduce pollution of the atmosphere as well as to strengthen policies for the fair sharing of wealth so that everyone can be part of the change towards stewardship of earth and atmosphere. Pope Francis has said, "If we damage the environment we damage the poor".

The Public Issues Working group has prepared a draft policy. We are inviting all bodies of the church to engage with this policy, as it affects the many aspects of church life, from theology and faith to financial investments, management of church properties and what goods churches buy. Climate justice involves us all in moving away from being part of causes of pollution to living well with the earth.
